Baptist Wing Lung Secondary School had a plant visit to Green Island Cement Company. Students and teachers were briefed on elements of element-producing and the production flow. Besides, they had a walk to our warehouse, water storage tank and control room. Curious students paid attention to every single briefing of each stage of production process, product control and preventive measures at work. Our rooftop brightened them with a wonderful landscape (where the airport was in the opposite side).



Alex and Daniel wrote an article sharing their interview with Mr. Tsang and also their plant tour experience in their school magazine “Baptizine” (posted on p.14). They described the visit is an “eye-opening experience” to them to see the actual process of making cement, including the composition of raw materials into the final cement product, our pond and recycling water station, and the “amazing” paper which can wrap more than 30 bags of cement, etc. However, they were more impressed with

our community service culture – our dedication to educate the public of our industry and business as well as our participation in serving different community groups.

A Visit to an Island and its Chief

A visit to Green Island Cement and an interview with Mr Eddy Tsang, the Executive Director.



Recently, we went to Green Island Cement for a study tour. It is the first time I have been to this kind of heavy industry. In this tour, I learned a lot about the industry and the company, Green Island Cement. We also had the opportunity to talk with Mr Eddy Tsang, the Executive Director of the company.

About the Company

In the company, the programming controls and directs the process of cement manufacturing. The composition of cement which includes Limestone (80%), Silica (9%), Fly ash (9%) and Iron (2%) is dosed precisely according to a predefined chemical composition, and is then fed into the process. Cement is manufactured through a number of unit operations which involve both physical and chemical reactions. It is an eye-opening experience to me to see the actual process of making cement.



Also, we saw many types of equipment and facilities in the factory, such as warehouse, water storage tank and the control building. For the warehouse, there are countless bags of cement. Each of the bags weighs 45 kgs. The thing that interests me is that they use a special paper to transport 20-30 bags of cement, but the paper will not tear. For the water storage tank, it is a 7,000 m³ pond which can effectively collect rainwater for the 150,000 m² plant site and recycle the water used during the operation process. Through the control building, the supervisors closely monitor the production process and protect operators from any potential risks with the aid of a sophisticated computer control system.



We are also impressed with the caring culture of the company, which does not care about profit only. They offer a lot of social programmes for different communities, and

welcome public education institutes like our school to visit in order to let students know more about the industry and the potential career options. This all comes from the company's strong sense of social responsibility.

About the Executive Director

Also we had a valuable opportunity to talk to Mr. Eddy Tsang, the executive director of the company. Mr Tsang is a successful person from whom we can learn a lot. When he was young, he loved playing basketball and spent so much time in it. In other words, he had to be extra hard-working after his sports time. He woke up at 5 in the morning to study. He managed his studies well and graduated from a University in Australia. Mr Tsang is a good model for us with successful work-play balance.

Mr Tsang started his career in 1981 when he was 23 years old. He started to work as an accountant. Also, he kept on learning, always adding value to his personal assets. In the interview, Mr Tsang gave us some tips about working in Hong Kong society. First and also the most important thing is we should be a person of integrity. Second, we should train our ability. Third, we need to devote to work whole-heartedly, and finally we must be a reliable person. These four tips are important to working in this society. Nowadays, Hong Kong society is becoming more and more competitive. We need to listen to advice from successful people like Mr Tsang.

About his experience as an executive director, Mr Tsang shared how he managed his staff. First, he mentioned that the importance of motivation in a company. Second, to build up a strong team-work, the company has a comprehensive training programme. Third, Mr Tsang tries all he can to provide an enjoyable working environment for his people. Lastly, in his company, there are 400 employees working for him. If the company cannot sustain, 400 families (about 1200 people) will be affected, so Mr Tsang bears a big responsibility to keep his company growing and developing healthily. At the end of the meeting, Mr Tsang reminded us to prepare ourselves well to face future opportunities because opportunities will not wait for anyone.

In our visit to this company and the interview with Mr Tsang, we have learned much from the first-hand experience of the operation and the candid sharing of the executive director. In addition to knowledge of this industry, we can get some insights about our future career.
