About the SPED

To support the employment of persons with disabilities, the Social Welfare Department (SWD) has launched the Support Programme for Employees with Disabilities (SPED) which provides employers of persons with disabilities with a one-off subsidy for procurement of assistive devices and/or workplace modifications. The SPED aims at facilitating employees with disabilities to discharge their duties at the workplace and enhancing their work efficiency.

Po Leung Kuk (PLK) is commissioned by SWD to administer the SPED. Assessors from PLK will contact SPED applicants to assess the appropriateness of the proposed assistive devices and/or modification works. The SPED Assessment Committee of SWD will vet the applications with reference to PLK's assessment and recommendation.

Service Provision

1. To carry out territory-wide promotion of the SPED ;
2. To encourage employers to procure assistive devices and/or carry out workplace modifications, with a view to facilitating their employees with disabilities to discharge their duties and enhancing their work efficiency;
3. To assist employers to apply for subsidies under the SPED;
4. To conduct assessment on individual applications and prepare reports for consideration by the Assessment Committee;
5. To enhance public understanding of the potentials and abilities of persons with disabilities.

Application Procedures

- Employers of persons with disabilities should be referred by any of the following organisations –
 - (a) NGOs operating SWD-subsented vocational rehabilitation services;
 - (b) NGOs running training courses for persons with disabilities or persons recovering from work injuries with the funding support of the Employees Retraining Board;
 - (c) Selective Placement Division of the Labour Department;
 - (d) Vocational Training Council.
- Applicants may also contact PLK SPED office for assistance.
- SWD will invite applications at quarterly intervals.

- Applications from employers should be made on the prescribed application form to SWD through the referring organisations, together with quotations from at least two suppliers for each item.
- Assessors from PLK will make appointment with the applicants as soon as referrals are received from SWD.
- Following approval of the subsidy, successful applicants shall procure the devices and/or carry out the modification works within two months. Assessors from PLK will visit the workplace for inspection, monitoring and evaluation.

- Applicants may consult PLK for cases requiring special arrangement.

Subsidy and Scope of Support

- The subsidy is one-off in nature. The subsidy is basically capped at a maximum support level of \$20,000 for each employee with disabilities. A grant up to \$40,000 may be considered for deserving cases for which the price of a single item of assistive device and its essential accessories being applied for has exceeded \$20,000.
- A wide range of assistive devices and workplace modifications which caters for the special needs of employees with disabilities at the workplaces may be supported. Examples include accessories or adaptive equipment for computer, optical magnifying device, hearing and assistive devices, Braille products, handrails, etc.

Special Provisions

- Successful applicants are not allowed to sell, rent or transfer any of the items funded by the SPED to other organisations or individuals/ employees, unless with prior approval of SWD.
- Upon termination of the employment contract(s) with the employee(s) with disabilities concerned, successful applicants should make use of the subsidised items to benefit other employee(s) with disabilities.
