



I extend my appreciation to the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce and the Hong Kong Police Force for running this meaningful scheme over the past



## Keeping Hong Kong safe

For the past 32 years, the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce and the Hong Kong Police Force have jointly run the Good Citizen's Award Scheme to commend many civic-minded citizens for their valuable assistance in the apprehension of criminals and the detection of crime. Such a meaningful project was made possible with generous donations from the business sector, administered by the Chamber, back in 1973.

As the Commissioner of Police, maintaining law and order in Hong Kong is a primary concern; and to the 7 million Hong Kong people living in the territory, it certainly is their wish that Hong Kong remains a safe and stable place in which they can lead their lives in peace. It is the vision of the Hong Kong Police that Hong Kong remains one of the safest and most stable societies in the world. This can only be achieved with the full support of the community we serve.

In 2005, Hong Kong continued to see a drop in overall crime as compared with the previous year, and the drop in 'theft,' in particular opportunist crimes, has recorded a significant decrease in percentage. For instance, snatching and vehicle theft fell 15.6% and 14.7% respectively and pickpocketing cases


fell 24.8%. Our detection rate was 44.3% and this was similar to last year. Among those cases that were detected, quite a number of them were due to our good citizens who acted swiftly to stop a criminal in the process of committing an offence, or otherwise provided valuable information to the Police leading to the arrest of the culprits. Without their assistance, many criminals might be still at large, committing more crimes and causing more victims to suffer. The Good Citizen Award is a most appropriate means to thank these members of the public and to show our appreciation for their good deeds. It also serves as a strong incentive to other members of the public to join in the fight against crime.

I must thank the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce for their unfailing support throughout the past 32 years for giving out cash awards to more than 3,000 awardees. It is not just the money that counts, but the genuine support given to the Police Force in mobilizing public participation in the fight against crime.

Last year when the Chamber noticed a shortage of funding to continue the GCA Scheme, Chamber CEO Dr Eden Woon suggested holding a fund raising function so that the Chamber can continue running this meaningful project jointly with the Police Force. I must extend my sincere and heartfelt appreciation for the Chamber's commitment in maintaining their contribution to the Good Citizen Award. I wish the fund raising effort every success.

I look forward to seeing more and more good citizens receiving the Award and the Police Force will continue to pursue our vision to keep Hong Kong one of the safest and most stable societies in the world.

## Chamber joined the battle against crime

Hong Kong in 1973 was a city caught up in a spiralling crime wave. Reports about armed robberies or muggings involving dangerous weapons in broad daylight, often in the most crowded areas, were taking place daily. The public and business owners were growing increasingly worried, and Hong Kong's image overseas was being damaged.

The Government formed the Fight Violent Crime Committee in March 1973 to coordinate efforts of the Government and public in assisting the Police fight crime. Jack Cater, then Secretary for Information and chairman of the committee, wrote to the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce on May 23, 1973, inviting the Chamber to administer a Good Citizen Award, as part of Hong Kong's battle against crime.

Considering a safe society essential for business, the Chamber gladly took up this invitation. With an initial fund of \$736,400 (\$4.1 million in today's money) pledged by businesses to help fight crime, the Chamber began awarding brave citizens who had helped the Police arrest criminals. Since the first award was presented to the first eight citizens in June 1973, a total of 3,308 citizens ranging from 6 to 79 years old have been presented Good Citizen Awards for their bravery.

## How the Chamber raised – and gave away – millions of dollars

HKGCC Members have played a crucial role in ensuring the success of the Good Citizen Award. Through Members' generous support, 3,308 citizens (as of February 2006) have been rewarded for helping the Police arrest criminals.

In the early years of the award, citizens were awarded a certificate and cheque within days of their good deed. The Police would recommend to the Chamber citizens who they thought deserved an award, and the Chamber decided upon the amount. Hundreds of presentations took place at the Chamber by former chairmen, General Committee members and directors, but in the late 1980s it was agreed that Good Citizens should be rewarded in large-scale award presentation ceremonies arranged three or four times annually.

Two fund raising drives have taken place since the establishment of the initial fund of \$736,400 (\$4.1 million in today's money) in 1973. By August 1979, over 600 awards had been made and the fund had almost been run down. Following discussion between the Government and the Chamber, the Secretary for Home Affairs and the Commissioner of Police recommended that the scheme ought to continue and that a public appeal be organized to raise more funds. One month after the appeal had begun on June 20, 1979, almost \$1 million (\$5 million in today's money) had been raised.

The last fund raising drive was launched on April 30, 1987, and a target of \$2 million was set. By mid-May, the Fund Raising Committee, Chaired by Daniel Koo, had raised some \$1.5 million, and by the end of the campaign, \$2.012 million (\$9.5 million in today's money) had been secured, which has been sufficient to keep the award running for almost two decades.

For this fund raising drive, we hope to replenish the fund through members' generous donations and a special fund raising dinner which will take place after HKGCC's Annual General Meeting on April 25, 2006, to ensure the scheme continues for many more years.

A special Good Citizen Award was made to Chan Kam-chuen at Shamshuipo Police Station on July 8, 1977, for his bravery in trying to stop two armed payroll robbers. Mr Chan was outside a factory building when he witnessed an armed robbery by two men. He chased after the men, without any thought for his own safety. but was unable to stop the men driving off with part of the payroll. During his attempt, he was hit on the head and suffered light injury. Mr Chan didn't work for the firm whose payroll was stolen, and his attempt to stop the robbers was considered extremely brave.

## **HKGCC's Good Citizen Award** brought out the stars

Over 16,000 people turned out for the first large-scale public presentation of the Chamber's Good Citizen Award on Sunday, July 7, 1974. The entire Tse Wan Shan playground in Wong Tai Sin and surrounding slopes were packed with people eager to watch the "show."

Chamber officers found themselves in unusual company as their colleagues for the day were stars from HKTVB, including several from the popular "Enjoy Yourself Tonight" programme. The stars had turned out to support the Good Citizen Award programme and handed out prizes totalling \$29,000 (about \$162,000 in today's money) to the 11 crime-fighting citizens selected to receive awards on the day.

The youngest of the 11 was 6-year-old schoolboy Fung Man-chung, who paved the way for the arrest of his kidnappers. He received \$5,000 and also became the youngest award winner. Two of the other awardees received \$4,000 each for foiling separate robberies.



## Alert teller thwarted con on the elderly

Yiu Sau-fong was among the 40 citizens commended for their bravery in helping the Police fight crime during a Good Citizen Award presentation on June 12, 2003.

Ms Yiu assisted Police in foiling an attempted deception, when on November 26, 2002, she heard two women and a man approach an elderly woman in Sha Tin claiming they knew a supernatural doctor who could dispel bad luck and cure illnesses. Convinced by the group of three, the victim took cash and valuables totalling HK\$48,000 from her home and went to withdraw another HK\$40,000 from a bank.

Feeling suspicious, Miss Yiu, a bank teller, informed the Police about the suspect, who was later convicted and sentenced to two years' imprisonment.



**Four Good Citizens** prevented tragedy

Four men at a Good Citizen Award Presentation Ceremony on June 11, 2004, were praised for preventing what could have been an horrific tragedy. The recipients, Kwai Sze-kit, Fung Kwong-chung, Chan Man-cheong and Leung Lun-chiu (right), helped arrest an arsonist who set fire to a bottle of thinner inside a compartment of an MTR train travelling from Tsim Sha Tsui to Admiralty Station.

Witnessing the incident, Mr Kwai immediately stopped the man and tried to put out the fire. His efforts alerted Mr Fung, Mr Chan and Mr Leung, who immediately joined him in helping extinguish the fire. The four passengers later provided detailed information to the Police, leading to the arrest of the culprit who was subsequently charged with arson.

Another of the 40 recipients, Wong Yue-pok, helped arrest a child abductor. In this case, a man lured a 7-year-old girl out of a barbershop in Wong Tai Sin on February 6, 2004. An identity kit of the suspect was later circulated to shops in the district. Spotting a man with features similar to those of the suspect on February 13, Mr Wong, a fish stall owner, followed the man and reported to the Police, leading to the arrest of the man who was later charged with common assault and abduction.

## **Latest Good Citizen** of the Year Award

Forty-one citizens who helped the police fight crime were commended at a Good Citizen Award presentation ceremony on January 5, 2006. One of the awardees, Tse Kin-fai, also won the top honour of the year - Good Citizen of the Year Award.

Mr Tse helped subdue a man who snatched a mobile phone from a woman and injured her with a cutter near Shau Kei Wan MTR Station on November 28, 2004. Mr Tse also received injuries to his hand and neck before finally managing to subdue the suspect. The man was arrested and later sentenced to four years and four months imprisonment upon conviction of robbery and assault with intent to resist lawful apprehension. Mr Tse was presented with a plaque and a cash award of \$3,000. Each of the Good Citizen Award winners also received a certificate and a cheque for \$2,000.
