She is recognized for her expertise in the field as well as her evangelical promotion of e-commerce in the Asian Region. Prior to joining Dickson Cyber Concepts, Cindy Cheng was General Manager of e-business & Multi Industry Solutions at IBM Greater China for 4 years.

As General Manager of e-business and multi-industry solutions, Cindy Cheng was responsible for implementing IBM's business objectives in China, Taiwan and Hong Kong (Greater China Group). This included development of IBM's marketing strategy, promoting awareness and adoption of e-business, helping customers to build up information infrastructure and assisting them to grow their businesses with e-solutions.

Cindy Cheng began her career at IBM in 1977 as an application programmer in the United States and served in various positions in IBM Greater China until the end of 1999.

Cindy Cheng is very active in various industry and government advisory committees. She is the Chair of the e-Committee of Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce, the Vice President of the Hong Kong Information Technology Federation and Council Member of the Media & Communications Service Advisory of the Hong Kong Trade Development Council.
