James T.H. Tang is Director of the Institute of China and Global Development, the University of Hong Kong. The Institute is a multidisciplinary focus at the University on teaching and research related to China's interactions with the global economy. He is also Head and Associate Professor at the Department of Politics and Public Administration at the University.

Specializing in the field of international relations, his research and teaching interests include Chinese foreign policy, international political economy in the Asia-Pacific region, and political transition in Hong Kong. A graduate of the University of Hong Kong, he obtained his M.Phil. in international relations from Cambridge University and Ph.D. from the London School of Economics. Before his appointment at the University of Hong Kong, he worked in the research department of the Hong Kong Trade Development Council and taught in the National University of Singapore. His current research projects include: "the localization of Chinese foreign policy", "Hong Kong's role in the World Trade Organization", and "non-traditional security in East Asia".
