- The Composite CPI covers about 90% of households in Hong Kong with a monthly household expenditure of HK\$4,500-65,999 per month in the base period (1999/2000), and its year-on-year rate of change is often taken as a measure of general inflation

- Broadband means the capacity to transmit data at the rate of 1.5Mbps or above using family of Digital Subscriber Line (xDSL), Local Multipoint Distribution Services (LMDS), Fibre-to-the-Building (FTTB), cable modem or other technologies
- The tourism sector was hit by the Travel Advisory of the World Health Organization against Hong Kong from 2 April to 23 May 2003 due to the Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) outbreak
